Why do we do home visits?

- It is an opportunity for the family to meet the people who will be caring for your child.
- It will help your child to settle into pre-school more effectively having seen and met staff in their own home.
- It enables Stretton Pre-school to gather information in order to support individual needs such as allergies, special educational needs, likes and dislikes.
- It is an opportunity to gain information about Stretton Pre-school and find out how you can be involved.
- It is a chance to share information and talk privately about any issues or concerns you have about your child.
- It serves as the starting point for building the important relationship between home and Stretton Pre-school.
- It helps the child and family manage the transition from home to Stretton Pre-school.
- It is an opportunity to find out about the sort of activities that your child will be able to take part in Stretton Pre-school.

What to expect?



Two members of staff will visit.

- The visit will last approximately 20 minutes to half an hour
- The staff member will talk to you about your child's development, may ask to see the child's red book.
 - The staff will have some questions they will need to ask you about your child, such as their likes and dislikes and dietary needs.
- They may have some information to give you.
